### Impacts

- Country profiles developed, providing an overview of green financing, including sources of funding for green investments and an assessment of the potential for sustainable growth
- Two regional conferences on financing eco-innovations organised, one in CEE and one in Ukraine
- A set of recommendations compiled and disseminated to relevant financial institutions and policy makers

### Activities

- Strengthening the development and implementation of the green infrastructure concept in EU regions
- Facilitating the exchange and dissemination of expertise, experience and best practices among partners in order to ensure the sustainability of the results achieved

### Impacts

- Publication of the Green Infrastructure Action Toolkit, consolidating the substantive results of project activities
- Establishment of the European Green Infrastructure Knowledge Network, enabling stakeholders across Europe to capitalise on project achievements and exchange and transfer experience, expertise and best practices after the end of the project

By identifying and transferring good practices, the project will promote the conservation of biodiversity within a broader policy framework including agriculture, forestry and climate change adaptation
